
Thanksgiving for Baptism

- P In the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- P Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we are clothed with God's mercy and forgiveness. Let us give thanks for the gift of baptism.
- C We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight.

Gospel Mark 1:4-11



Glory and praise to you, O God, Author of life, Word made flesh, Power of the Most High, now and forever.


