Pastor's Message

One of our members joined the staff for lunch the other day. Perhaps noticing how much quieter the building is now without the Little Lambs Preschool in session, he asked, "So, is there less work to do this time of year?"

We all laughed.

While it is true that there are fewer events happening and many of our congregation's programs are coming into a lull around the turn of the season, there is certainly no shortage of work in the church office. There are still bulletins (and newsletters!) to produce, worship services to plan, members to call, and many other things to keep us busy.

I think of this as we not only move from spring into summer, but from our "festival year" (Advent through Pentecost) into the long, green season known in the Church as "ordinary time." The Sundays from here through the end of November are numbered ("ordinary" refers to being "numbered," not "mundane") as "Sundays after Pentecost," and they stretch into what sometimes seems like an interminable stretch of "ordinariness." Depending on when Easter falls, there can be as many as 23 Sundays after Pentecost—almost a literal "month of Sundays."

However, although there are few special holidays to break up this "month of Sundays," the time is, in some ways, anything but "ordinary." The color for this season is green, recalling the growth we see mirrored in the foliage outside. This is a season of growth for Christians, too, as we reflect on the "ordinary" work of discipleship. Having inhabited again the cycle of Jesus stories from the Incarnation through the Resurrection, we are now given the opportunity to allow those stories to inhabit us: to shape and form us for ministry.

These first few Sundays in July in particular are stories about discipleship: to what Jesus calls us, the cost of that following, and how we might follow that call. This is a time for us to contemplate what discipleship means for each of us. How am I called to follow? Why do I follow?

As we consider these questions in our individual lives, we are also encountering them as a community. Who is Agnus Dei? How is Christ calling this community into God's work? How will we respond to that call? Especially now in the wake of COVID, these questions have become even more important for us to think about. Beginning this summer, the Church Council will be working on a plan to lead us in contemplating these questions as a community with the intent to discern a vision, mission and values for our congregation moving forward.

The task of discipleship is communal as much as it is individual. Even as we are each called to consider if, how and why we are following Jesus, we are called to ask these questions together. As we enter into this "ordinary time" I look forward to contemplating with you what "ordinary" life as an "ordinary" congregation looks like for us, and growing together into that reality to which God is calling us. Blessings on your summer!


