#### **Transition Team Report**

The Transition Team would like to thank the 57 people that have participated in the conversations with the team during August. Your feedback will help the Transition Team develop ADLC's Vision for Mission that is part of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) needed for the call process.

With busy summer plans and another round of Covid spreading, the Transition Team knows that the August planned dates and times did not work for everyone, so we will conduct additional group conversations during the Adult Forum on Sunday, September 17<sup>th</sup>. Come to the forum if you have missed out on previous opportunities or if you have attended a session and have additional comments you would like to add to the conversations. The Transition Team would really like to hear from people in the young adult to 50 age group. Our previous conversations have not had many participants in this age group.

Once the group conversations are completed, the Transition Team will work on collating the information for the MSP. We hope to have this work completed by early October. The MSP will then be shared with the congregation for feedback and tweaked if needed before it is passed on to the Council for approval. Once approved, it will be sent to the Synod who will share it with prospective pastor candidates. The Call Committee will use the MSP as part of interviewing process to find the best pastor that will support the Vision for Mission of ADLC.



A template letter will be available, making writing the letters quick and easy!

At 11:00, bring your root beer float to the parish hall to hear Loren Bell briefly explain the wide-ranging effects of this bill and why its reauthorization is so crucial. You can write your letters on a laptop then, or take the letter template home to write them later.

We will collect the letters on Sunday, Sept. 17 during the offertory. Please bring your letters along that day if you write them at home. All the letters will be mailed together to the ELCA WA DC office for delivery to our legislators.

We are privileged to have Loren Bell as our presenter, since he has been involved for over 40 years in programs to ensure access to healthy foods for low-income families. These leadership positions include: Director of Nutrition Services for the WA State Dept. of Public Health, the Governor's Task Force on Hunger, Director of the Center for Food Assistance and Nutrition for a national research firm, and providing assistance to the Pacific Trust Territories and multiple Tribal Programs, the Michigan Nutrition Network, among other projects.

The team is especially hoping to hear from people in the young adult to 50 age group.

September 24th - Don Krump will offer a look at the church-wide Emergency Preparedness Guide. The time will include instruction in the use of our AED defibrillator, our fire extinguishers and it will include a drill either for a lock-down or evacuation. An important meeting for caring for our community and ourselves while at the church.

**Forum** meets after worship on Sunday mornings in the parish hall. Throughout the year a variety of topics are presented: theology, politics, the arts, world religions, contemporary issues, religious history—all with the intention of providing a vigorous, rich learning environment where the Christian faith is at the center.

This month we are going to look back at some of the stories from last month (and one new one) but from a different perspective. In Mark 14:3-9 and John 12:1-8, we learn of the woman who pours expensive ointment on Jesus's feet and then wipes his feet with her hair. If we look at this story from a (good) stewardship perspective (as some in attendance did) it doesn't seem to make sense. These people were thinking that the ointment could have been sold and used to benefit the poor and needy. Jesus looks at the motivation behind the act and points out that the gift is an expression of love and adoration.

In the story of Zacchaeus, we could wonder why Jesus was happy with him giving away only half of his wealth when he told the other rich man to give away all his wealth. In the story of the poor widow, Jesus praised her for giving all she had to the temple. The same temple that he called a "den of robbers" in Luke 19:45-46 and accused the leaders of using the money for their own extravagances.

What do all these anecdotes have in common? These three people all made their gifts out of love and adoration. The stories point out that Christians need to worship God, and they do this by offering their treasures in a spirit of devotion and adoration. We learn from these stories that it is not how much we give, or where to give, or how to give, but why we give. When we give because of our devotion to God it becomes easy to decide how much and where we give our treasure.

#### Our Piano Is Getting a "Tune-Up"

Just as our vehicles periodically need to have their tires replaced and parts adjusted, so it is with musical instruments.

After 36 years, our lovely Kawai grand piano is due for a visit to the shop for such maintenance, and thanks to the generous memorial donation of Marvin and Maureen Rivenes we are able to undertake that work at this time. (Maureen would certainly smile radiantly, knowing that the piano -- which she dearly appreciated and loved playing every Friday morning while Marvin was in Bible Study -- was being cared for.)

The work will include replacement of the hammers, shanks, flanges, and back checks, as well as regulation of the action, voicing of the hammers, and tuning, all of which will provide an appreciable improvement in the control of the volume and tone, as well as a significant increase in sustain throughout the piano. We expect to have it back in service, sounding lovelier than ever, by mid-September or so.

The piano has been a wonderful addition to the spiritual and worship life of the church as well as to the community, having also been used regularly for recitals and music teachers' events through the years. The work being done is very much a worthwhile investment in the piano and our musical life going forward.
